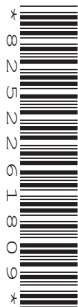

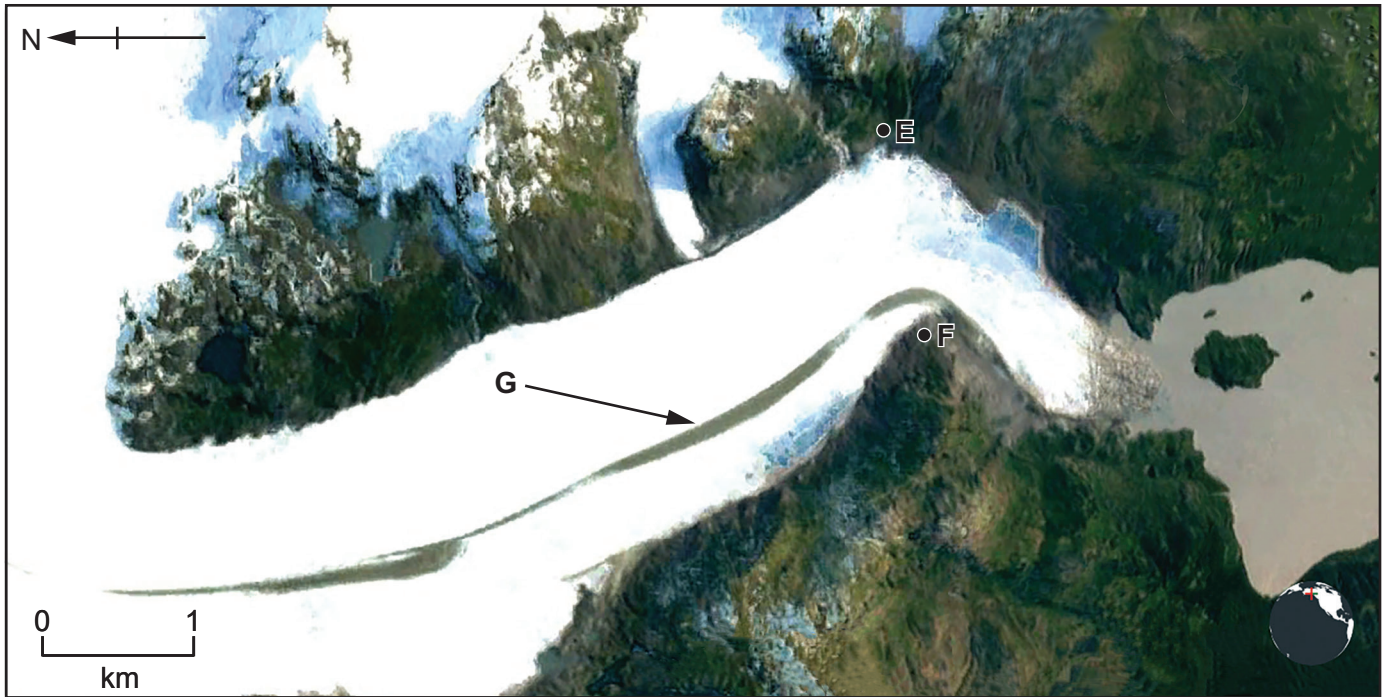


Fig. 4 – Aklavik, Canada

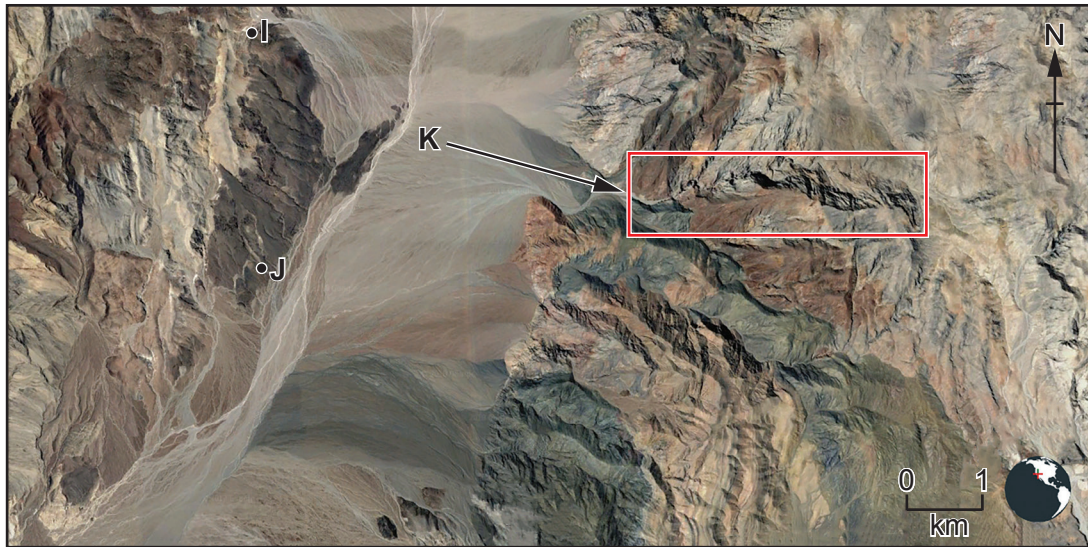
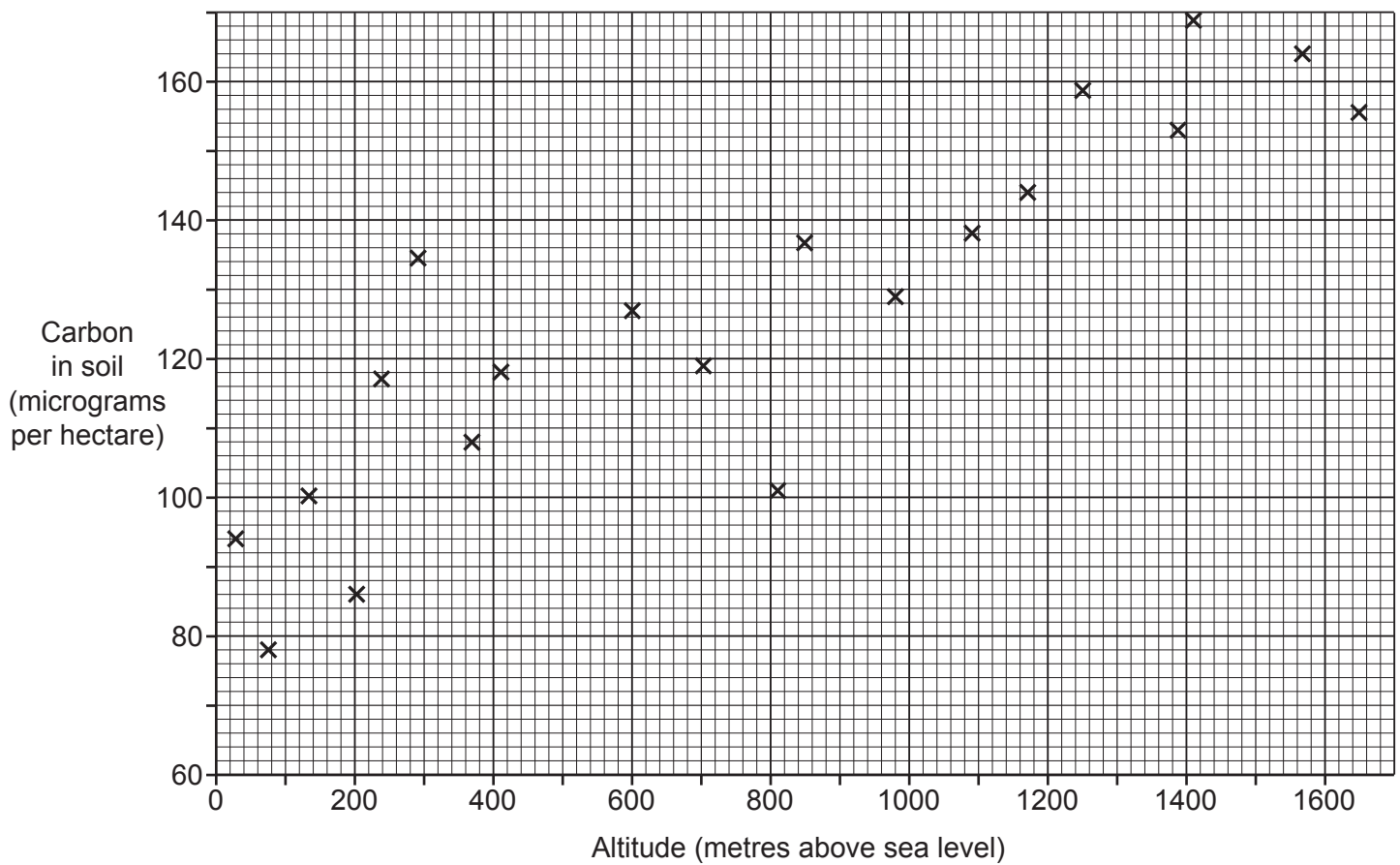


Fig. 6 – Nevada, USA
